As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway, and Sweden. We give thanks for the rich and varied heritage of the churches, large and small, in these Nordic countries; for ecumenical and spiritual renewal movements that bring new intensity and depth to the Christian faith; for a witness for justice and peace that may become a strong example to the rest of the world; for the example of giving towards the development of other peoples; for snow and skiing, woods and mountains, lakes and fiords; and for the white nights of summer and the bare winter light. We pray for efforts to overcome violence, racial/ethnic discrimination, and the abuse of children and women; for equal rights and self-determination of the indigenous peoples; for refugees and migrants who seek a better life in these countries; and for those churches trying to find new vitality, so they can be faithful witnesses to the Gospel.
