We pray for religious groups who are oppressed despite official freedom of religion; for Chinese inhabitants of Brunei who have been denied citizenship and face discrimination; for the poor of Brunei, that they gain access to the means necessary to sustain and nourish themselves; for peace among the many ethnic groups within these countries; for the protection and encouragement of religious freedom; for political reforms and democratization in Malaysia; for the respectful use of natural resources and sustainable practices; and for women, who in some of these countries are treated as second-class citizens.
