From the Pastor's Desk

It seems that it has been a season of Continuing Education for me. A banner-making workshop in January, Austin Seminary's Midwinter Lectures in February and I'm headed to St. Louis in a couple of weeks for the Kaleidoscope Stewardship conference.

This congregation provides for Continuing Education for their pastor, as do all PC(USA) churches. It reflects our emphasis on education and learning and, because we are connected as a denomination, we have many opportunities for time with colleagues and experts.

More than a time to hone or get more tools, Con Ed has always been a time for me to step back and to look at what we are doing as a congregation. What is working? What needs to be tweaked a bit? What needs to be thrown out and rebuilt?

Lent is a bit like that, too. It is a time set apart for us to take a look at our relationship with the Triune God. What parts of our relationship are strong? Where do we need a little help? Where do we need to completely get out of the way for God to reach us? Do we need new tools to help us?

Have you looked at your relationship with God during this Lenten season? Even if you didn't take up a Lenten discipline, it's not too late to use these next few weeks as a time apart, a time that you might discover a way for God to reach you.

I mentioned my discipline for Lent in last month's Messenger. I'm "fasting" from electronics (computers, TV, phone) for a time each day. It has been a process; early on I set a timer and was checking it often. I am slowly becoming more content in the silence. During these fasts, I may or may not be praying in words, but I'm hearing what is *really* going on around me. It has been—and I expect will continue to be—a time of growth for me. It will likely be a habit I continue on some level after Easter.

It is tempting to think I will be ready for Easter after the forty days of Lent. I can only say that I will be *more* ready than I was at the beginning of Lent.

Is anyone really ready for Easter? Can any human fully understand the meaning of God's Son dying and being resurrected for us?

The good news is that God accepts us as we are, in whatever form of readiness we bring. So, come all and rejoice in the Good News of the Risen Lord as we gather on Easter Sunday, March 31!

Clerk's Corner



Fellowship and Hospitality Committee Up-Coming March Events




