Biblical scholar and professor Bart Erman of the University of North Carolina examines the testament from a historical point of view in this excellent DVD-based series. Sunday School Kick-Off: There will be no Sunday School for children and youth on Labor Day Sunday, September 1. The kick-off for the new church school year will be Sunday, September 8 in the Fellowship Hall beginning at 9:30 A.M. There will be a breakfast and an intergenerational program to help children, youth, young adults, and older adults become better connected.

Beginning September 15th, the second **adult Sunday School class** will begin a new study. The group, which meets in the church library from 9:30-10:30, will be discussing a book written by the Rev. Dr. Jim Wallis, entitled: *Rediscovering Values - on Wall Street, Main Street, and Your Street*. This book was written in the context of the 2007-08 economic crisis. He expresses that asking "When will this crisis be over?" is the wrong question. He suggests very strongly that we need to ask: "How will this crisis change us?" In this book Wallis provides a moral compass for the economy that is emerging. Join us as we examine this provocative study of our economy, and how our faith needs to play a part in how we deal with it.—Harry Wright

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Sometimes the answer is "No."

It's been 100 days since the tornadoes struck Oklahoma. In the disaster world, that time tends to mark the distinction between *response*—immediate clean-up, housing, securing belongings—and *recovery*—rebuilding and addressing long term needs. Our church was asked to consider being a host site for volunteers who would be coming to work on rebuilding homes in the coming months. Host sites provide meals and sleeping quarters (at a minimum) for a week at a time as a home base for groups from around the country who offer their time and skill in rebuilding communities.

And so we began to discern. Session members studied the pages and pages of materials provided by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. They conference called. They discussed and prayed. And they discussed and prayed some more. The need is certainly there, but in the end, the session determined that this was not a project our congregation could take on at this time. There was sadness that we could not offer this hospitality, but also recognition of our limits. We can assist in recovery, but it will need to be in another way.

As much as we would like, we cannot be all things to all people. Sometimes the answer is "No."

Sometimes the answer is "Yes."

And here is what we are saying "Yes" to this fall. Sunday School kickoff on 9/8, Dogs of Lexington video and presentation on 9/27, Blessing of the Animals on 9/29, Kids' Club beginning 9/18 and hosting National Night Out on 10/1!

Beginning on September 5, I am starting a Bible study on Thursday mornings at 10:30. We will meet for an hour or so. Let's begin at the beginning by looking at Genesis. Bring a Bible and bring a friend!


