the ordinary means of salvation,

and offers of grace by Christ, to all members of it,

in the ministry of the gospel,

testifying that whosoever believes in him shall be saved, and excluding none that will come unto him.

The church's commission,

Theological Declaration of Barmen upon which its freedom is founded, consists in delivering the message of the free grace of God to all people in Christ's stead, and therefore in the ministry of his own Word and work through sermon and Sacrament.

The church confesses its faith when it bears a present witness to God's grace in Jesus Christ. The life, death, resurrection, and promised coming of Jesus Christ has set the pattern for the church's mission. The church follows this pattern Confession of 1967
