New Adult Church School Class: Beginning Sunday, February 2, 2014 at 9:30 A.M. in the church library, a new class will be offered—Psychology and Religion. The topic will be studied up to and including Palm Sunday, April 13. For many years, psychology and religion have been viewed as antagonists, but in the last decade empirical studies have joined the two disciplines in several areas, including the role of spirituality in psychotherapy. Topics to be covered will include the role of religion in the study of the brain, human development, social forces, psychopathology, and therapy, to mention a few. The psychology part will be presented through a video series, *Discovering Psychology*. There will also be written information, which will help in the discussion process. Each session can stand alone. Elder Harry Wright, who is a clinical psychologist, will be facilitating the class in most sessions.

Sunday Movie Matinee: Join us Sunday, February 9 to see the movie, *Monuments Men.* Based on the true story of the greatest treasure hunt in history, the film is an action drama focusing on an unlikely World War II platoon, tasked by FDR with going into Germany to rescue artistic masterpieces from Nazi thieves and returning them to their rightful owners. It would be an impossible mission: with the art trapped behind enemy lines, and with the German army under orders to destroy everything as the Reich fell, how could these guys—seven museum directors, curators, and art historians, all more familiar with Michelangelo than the M-1—possibly hope to succeed? But as the Monuments Men, as they were called, found themselves in a race against time to avoid the destruction of 1000 years of culture, they would risk their lives to protect and defend mankind's greatest achievements. We will see the film at the Warren Theater in Moore, at a time to be announced later.

Dear Friends,

I suspect you are familiar with the concept of vertical and horizontal, in relation to our connection with God. Generally defined (at least as I remember it), the vertical refers to more of a direct connection to God through worship, prayer, meditation and study. Though we don't limit God to being "above" us, it may help to think of being on an up-and-down line, seeking to get closer to God who is at one end.

The horizontal connection to God comes through our connection to all that God has created. We connect to God in fellowship with others, in outreach, and in mission. We see God in the face of others and we see God in our actions as we connect to one another. Worship can also be horizontal as we share our joys and concerns, pray corporately and sing hymns together.

All of us need both the horizontal and vertical. We may each have a preference, but we all need both. Which is dominant in your life now? Where do you need to focus on growth?

This week the session will be meeting to spend some time in planning for the upcoming months. As the session looks at the future of the church, we will be evaluating the opportunities for the congregation to make both vertical and horizontal connections. How can we improve? How can we provide opportunities for the congregation to connect to one another and to connect to God? I hope you will share your thoughts with me or with one of the elders.


