Seeking Panelists: On Friday, November 7, 2014 at 6:30 P.M. in the Fellowship Hall, the Christian Education Committee is sponsoring a panel discussion on "Mental Illness and Criminal Justice." The purpose of the forum is inform the public on the significant number of people with mental illness being incarcerated in Oklahoma's prisons. The OK Department of Mental Health states that the largest mental health hospital in our state is the Oklahoma County Jail, and that this pattern is evident throughout the state correction system. We are informing you of this event at this early date because we would like your suggestions as to who could serve on the panel. We will need resources in law enforcement, mental health, corrections, the state legislator, the courts, and consumers. From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

There are many things in ministry that I consider to be a privilege: praying with someone who is going into surgery, having someone share their good news with me, comforting a family member who has lost a loved one, and home communion to those who can't be in worship. These are just a few of the moments I treasure. It is a sacred time to be invited into someone's journey, to share in the most tender moments of life.

I would certainly add teaching Confirmation Class to this list. Since last September, Karen Upton and I have been meeting nearly weekly with the youth who will be joining the church this Sunday.

In March we attended (with Samuel McCann) the Confirmation Retreat at Dwight Mission. I saw them engaged and eager to learn and to experience all that Dwight had to offer. More than one of the leaders told me what a great group of kids I had!

They are six young people who are curious about the Christian faith, particularly our Presbyterian beliefs. They are thoughtful, caring and energetic. They are willing to serve, to grow in faith, and to live out their faith in their daily lives.

Their faith has grown and will continue to grow as they carry out their calling to be part of the body of Christ.

Several of them were baptized in this congregation; some were baptized other places. On Sunday they will make their public profession of faith. They take on the mantle of church membership, and commit to sharing in worship and ministry.

I would ask that you continue in prayer for these youth as they enter into this chapter of faith, and that you pray for and support all our young people, fulfilling the promises we made in their baptisms.

Saturday, May 10 at 11:30 A.M.

Kris Steele will address the annual meeting of the Norman League of Women Voters at Memorial Presbyterian Church on Saturday, May 10, from 11:30 A.M. to 1:30 P.M. During his tenure as Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, Mr. Steele oversaw the enactment of corrections reform that expanded the eligibility of low-risk, nonviolent inmates for community sentencing and electronic monitoring programs, and the passage of the Justice Reinvestment Initiative. Steele is now the director of The Education and Employment Ministry, (TEEM).



Book Review: Musicophilia

Music as Therapy for Alzheimer's and Other Illnesses

Then you will sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, making music to the Lord in your hearts. - Ephesians 5:19 (New Living Translation)


Oliver Sacks is a physician, best-selling author, and professor of neurology at the NYU School of Medicine. One of his acclaimed books is *Musicophilia: Tales of Music and the Brain*.

While the book covers several topics, of particular interest should be his concluding chapter, "Music and Identity: Dementia and Music Therapy".

The book makes a good case for the benefits of music therapy. From his research and experience as a neurologist, Dr. Sacks believes that music can aid aphasics and patients with Parkinson's, and it can help orient and anchor patients with advanced dementia because "musical perception, musical sensibility, musical emotion and musical memory can survive long after other forms of memory have disappeared."

Dr. Sacks indicates that music can elicit "emotions and associations that had been long forgotten, giving the patient access once again to mood and memories, thoughts and worlds that had seemingly been completely lost."


