We pray for people who live with the hard realities of persistent poverty, hunger, malnutrition, homelessness and unemployment; for farm workers and indigenous peoples, who are endangered by the loss of their lands and livelihoods, and those already displaced; for street children, especially in urban areas; and for women exploited in jobs where they are often treated as slaves.
