Today the **library adult Sunday school class** begins a new study series examining overtures considered at the General Assembly this past June in Detroit, Michigan. They covered a wide range of topics, including same sex marriage, divestment, social justice issues, peace initiatives, and the 1967 Belhar Confession. The purpose of the study is to encourage critical thinking on each topic, and to understand how our denomination is connecting our faith with issues that have an impact on the lives of people. The first topic-on the 17th and 24th-is the recommended change in the Book of Order regarding how marriage is to be defined. New participants are encouraged to join in on the discussion, which will be held in our Library room. This series will continue into the Fall church school schedule.

As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Oceania: American Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia (Maohi Nui), Kanaky, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu. We give thanks for the amazing diversity of these islands in the Pacific; for fish, oysters, deep blue waters, and those who know how to live in harmony with the sea; for the strong presence of the church in these nations; for welcoming smiles; for communities that take care of one another. We pray for those affected by earthquakes, volcanic activity and cyclones; for the rights of indigenous peoples throughout these islands; for an end to political unrest, violence and ethnic tensions; for an end to political corruption and crime; for those who are impoverished and hungry, those who are unable to find employment or to make a living, and those who are unable to attend school.
