As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for the Czech Republic, Poland, and Slovakia. We give thanks for those heroes, known and unknown, who threw off Nazi and Soviet domination; for pastors and priests who remained faithful to their calling even when they were persecuted; for traditions which hold people together and give them strength in difficult times; and for lead crystal glassware in intricate shapes and designs. We pray for economic stability in the transition from communism to a free-market economy; for the poor and the elderly, who bear the brunt of economic reforms; for the unemployed, and all who suffer the loss of state social services; for the victims of anti-Semitism, and ethnic, gender, and social intolerance in the midst of rising nationalism and the search for identity; for the environment, especially where it is heavily polluted; and for renewal of the church in the midst of both growing freedom and growing secularization.
