### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Three moments from this week I want to share:

First, I was contacted by a man whose father had died. He was asking to have his father's memorial service at our church because, though he didn't have a church home, his grandmother had been a member at Memorial and he remembered worshiping with her in the Fellowship Hall. When I met with him, we walked into the Fellowship Hall and he remembered being there for a candlelight vigil for the Iran Hostage Crisis of 1979 (FYI, his grandmother was Maybelle Rambo).

Also this week, I was sitting with my sister-in-law in the dining room of the Skilled Nursing Facility where she is currently staying. I visited with her and her two tablemates for a bit and then saw the first and last name of the woman sitting next to me. It was familiar, so I asked her if she was a member of my home church. Through a couple of questions, we realized that she knew my father, and she asked about his daughter who was the "nice minister who used to visit her in the hospital." It was me (surprise!); she remembered me from a brief stint I had on church staff.

This week we say goodbye to Kay and Laurie Anderson. We bid them God's blessing as they make their move to Tulsa. Laurie and Kay quickly made themselves at home at Memorial. They volunteered their time and talents, including Kay working with Kids' Club and Laurie volunteering in the office. They were with us just a short time, but they certainly made an impact with their grace, joy and willingness to serve.

So often we forget that all our actions can impact other people. I was fortunate this week to get to see some of the benefits of my ministry, to be a witness to the work of generations that worshiped before us at MPC, and reminded that though time may be fleeting, we can always bear witness to the love of God.

While we probably don't do good and faithful things to get something in return, it is certainly nice to occasionally get feedback. I hope you will get to experience the warmth of knowing that your actions matter.

#### **Christian Education Report**

#### **Adult Education Programs**

BIBLE STUDY: Are you interested in becoming more proficient in your understanding of The Bible? If so, plan on attending the Bible study that takes place each Thursday morning in our Library at 10:30 A.M. Rev. Evans uses the Lectionary as the basis for the discussion, and engages participants in the discernment experience. So if you enjoy "thinking out loud" about biblical issues – this is the place for you.

PARLOR SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS: The adult class, that meets in the Parlor every Sunday morning at 9:30, will continue in September its focus on the video lecture series, *Early Christianity: The Experience of the Divine*. In this series, Dr. Luke Timothy Johnson presents a view that considers the most familiar aspects of Christianity– its myths, institutions, ideas and morality–and sees these aspects as the outer "husks" of our faith. In his presentations, he takes people on a journey to find the "kernel" of Christianity's appeal: religious experience. He connects the origins, and how these elements can today influence new believers. Dr. Johnson is R. W. Woodruff Professor of New Testament and Christian Origins at Emory University in its School of Theology. The class considers such topics as What Is Religion?; The Role of Religious Experience; and Sourcing Christianity.


LIBRARY SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS: Every two (2) years the General Assembly of the PC(USA) meets to make decisions about constitutional issues, as well as how we as a denomination connect with various social issues as a witness of our faith in the world today. The Library Sunday Class has already discussed the amending of our denomination's constitution, as to how marriage is defined. From this point on the group will be discussing the following: The Confession of Belhar (this addresses justice, reconciliation, and unity in the context of South Africa); Divestment as a statement of witness; Can there be a "just war"?; Social Justice issues such as gun violence; Death Penalty issues; and Drug use policies. The group attempts to consider all sides of the issues, and encourages thoughtful discussion in a safe atmosphere.

In all of the above groups new members are welcome. Memorial Presbyterian's belief is that an educated membership is essential to being an effective witness of Jesus Christ in a very complex world.

#### The Actions of the Holy Spirit in the Life of Dwight Mission


Number 1 of twelve short articles submitted by Mary Helen Hite, Historian Indian Nations Presbyterian Women

Dwight Mission was formed in 1820 for the Cherokees by the Presbyterian American Board of Missions and (barely) financed by the U.S. Government. With the blessings of the Western Chief, Tahlonteeskee, Dwight was placed in Arkansas Territory where Lake Dardenelle is now located. These three groups of people–the Cherokees, the American Board of Missions, and the Federal Government–with only the desire for education in common managed to begin the long ministry of Dwight. The organizing minister, the Rev. Cephas Washburn, served twenty-two years with his wife, Abigail.


This educational ministry has moved, rebuilt facilities, stopped and re-started, changed ownership, and yet survives today near Vian, Oklahoma. How could this ministry continue against all odds? Only with the gift of patience from the Holy Spirit can what seems impossible be accomplished.

The sketch is of the buildings located at Dwight's Arkansas Territory campus.


