As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Bulgaria, Hungary, and Romania. We give thanks for the long history of Christianity in these countries; for those who give their lives to Christian prayer and service; for the care given to places of worship as, with icon and art, they proclaim the Gospel; for those caring for orphans, the elderly, and others without resources or family to take care of themselves; for those who make peace between ethnic groups; and for those who fight against the abuse of women. We pray for an end to corruption and organized crime, high unemployment, and limited supplies of food and housing; the environment, which continues to suffer severe degradation, and for all those who must deal with the pollution of the air they breathe and the water they drink; for a renewed ecumenical spirit among the churches; for those who face discrimination, hatred and violence on the basis of their ethnicity and religion; for the creation of stable economic and political systems that allow for the participation of all the peoples in these countries; and for healing for those who suffered under Marxist regimes.
