This year's **CROP Walk** will be held on Sunday, October 19, starting with 1:30 P.M. registration at Food and Shelter Inc., 104 W. Comanche. You may sign up for the walk and receive sponsor envelopes each Sunday preceding the event. CROP Walk is a program of Church World Service, a cooperative ministry of 36 denominations providing sustainable self-help and development, disaster relief and refugee assistance in more than 80 countries. Twenty-five percent of funds raised locally stay here in Norman to benefit Food and Shelter Inc., a non-profit agency that provides free meals and temporary family housing to those in need. By participating in CROP Walk, we are walking in solidarity with those who must walk miles every day for such basic necessities as food, water or medical care. We urge every member of Memorial to support CROP Walk through their prayers and participation—whether as a walker or as a sponsor.

The next **Sunday Matinee at the Movies** will be October 26. Depending upon availability, we will be seeing one of three films: *The Judge*, a comedy/drama which stars Robert Downey Jr. and Robert Duval; *The Good Lie*, a documentary about the lost children of Sudan; or *Men*, *Women*, *and Children*, a comedy/drama about parents attempting to deal with the effects of social media on family relationships. Fellowship & Hospitality will host **Trunk or Treat** on Friday, October 31, 6:30-8:00 P.M. Our goal is to have fifteen trunks in our parking lot giving out treats. We are looking for volunteers to help with the snack tent, games & moon bounce, set-up, and clean-up. We are also requesting specific items for people to donate for this community event. We will observe **All Saints' Day** on Sunday, November 2. We invite you to write the names of saints in your life on a white cloth that will cover the communion table during this service. The cloth will be made available for signing in the Fellowship Hall on Sundays in October. Following the All Saints' service will be the annual memorial service at the Columbarium for the remembrance of those there inurned.

As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Bangladesh, Bhutan, and Nepal. We give thanks for the beauty of the mountains, rivers and forests; for Christians who work together to serve the poor; for those who offer assistance during the many floods in Bangladesh and to the victims of arsenic contamination of drinking water; and for those who work for the rights of women and girls. We pray for a lessening of political unrest, violence and terrorism; for women, that they be respected and have dignity in their work; for children who must work to help feed their families, and girls who have been kidnapped or sold into the sex industry; for strength for those Christians who live as a minority amid Muslim, Buddhist and Hindu brothers and sisters; for those affected by frequent flooding, landslides, tropical storms and earthquakes; and for those who live as refugees, especially the stateless Rohingyas and others who are internally displaced, that they may find shelter, food and a means to make a living.
