As part of the ecumenical prayer cycle, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the

world each week. This week we pray for Republic of Congo, Gabon, Sao Tome and Principe. We give thanks for Christians who continue to witness to their faith even when it is disadvantageous to do so; for those who work with people living with HIV and AIDS and who are searching for ways to defeat the disease; for Albert Schweitzer, and other missionaries like him, who devoted their lives to the health and betterment of the people they served; and for the great tropical forest with its many forms of life. We pray for an end to violence and instability in the Republic of Congo; for all leaders, to use their power justly in service to all of the people, and to refrain from corrupt practices; for an end to autocratic rule; for those involved in subsistence agriculture, that their crops may be plentiful and they have enough food to eat and clean water to drink; for women, who often bear the brunt of poverty and receive less education than men and fewer opportunities; for an end to deforestation and desertification, and for the sustainable

and responsible use of natural resources; and for the just sharing of these countries' natural resources, particularly oil, so that all the people reap the benefits of what God

has given and not just those in power, or international corporations.
