Mark your calendars! The annual **Christmas Pageant** is scheduled for Sunday, December 7. The evening will begin with a potluck supper at 5:30 p.m., to be followed by the pageant at about 6:30. There will be a sign-up sheet for the potluck; please have your item at the church by 5;15, so that the kids can eat early and prepare for the pageant. We hope everyone will plan to come to enjoy a meal together and experience the Christmas story as told by Memorial's children.

As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania, and Niger. We give thanks for the freedom for Christians to worship in Mauritania even though it is an Islamic country; for Christians who retain their faith and continue to serve Christ even though they are tiny minorities in some of these countries; for those who depend on semi-nomadic and nomadic ways of life and who continue to survive and retain their ethnic heritage; and for those who plant trees to counter the spread of the desert. We pray for political and economic stability in Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger, an end to human rights abuses and slavery in Mauritania, and an end to civil war in Chad; for those who suffer from lack of water and food, particularly in desert regions; for refugees and those whose lives have been formed in the midst of violence and conflict; for an increase in the availability of education and medical care; for peace and reconciliation between tribes and ethnic groups; for reconciliation in families, in

marriages; and for an end to abuse against children and women.
