We pray that children may be able to grow in love and peace instead of hatred and violence; for the fullness of human life for people of all tribes and ethnicities in Liberia and Sierra Leone; for refugees displaced by civil war and political instability in neighboring countries, and those

returning after years of exile; for all who have suffered the ravages of civil war; for the healing of those broken in body, mind and spirit by the brutality of war; for orphans, displaced children, malnourished children, and children who live in fear; for the renewal of the forests, wildlife habitats and rich biodiversity; and for functioning economies emerging from the wreckage of civil war.
