Unity of the Church in a Time of Diversity: A presentation looking at the biblical, theological, and polity path of where the PC(USA) has been and where we are in light of the recent action of General Assembly (GA) on marriage. The Rev. Dr. Mark Achtemeier will be the presentation and conversation leader. Dr. Achtemeier has served the PC(USA) since 1984 as pastor, writer, and theologian. He taught theology and ethics for 15 years on the faculty of Dubuque Theological Seminary. He is an author; a member of the Peace, Unity and Purity GA Task Force; and an articulate voice on the marriage issue. This event will take place on Sunday, December 14 at 1:30 P.M. in the chapel at First Presbyterian Church of Oklahoma City, 1001 NW 25th St. This event is co-sponsored by Indian Nations Presbytery and the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Oklahoma City.
