As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Egypt, Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Israel and the Palestinian Territories. We give thanks for the ancient churches in these countries which have faithfully transmitted the Gospel from generation to generation, even when severely threatened or persecuted; for the

endless source of inspiration that pilgrims of Islam, Christianity and Judaism find in the sacred places in the land called holy; for peace-makers; for olive trees that have survived many generations and still produce fruit; for the Nile and its life-giving water; for the pyramids, hieroglyphic writing and other wonders of ancient Egyptian civilization; and for monks and nuns who give themselves to a life of prayer and service. We pray for peace in the region, especially in Syria and between Palestinians and Israelis; for respect for human rights; for the hungry and homeless; for those who insist on violent solutions and who see force as the primary means of solving conflicts, that they might find more humanitarian methods; and for refugees, who still yearn to return home.
