Pastor Tracy will lead a **Lenten Study** at 7:00 P.M. on Sunday nights, beginning February 22. We will be studying Henri Nouwen's *The Return of the Prodigal Son:* A *Story of Homecoming*. This beautiful book takes the story of the Prodigal and studies it through the image of Rembrandt's painting in his depiction of the familiar parable. There is a sign-up sheet on the pastor's office door for ordering the book. Paperback copies are \$10; e-book and audio versions are also available. Please invite your friends to join us, too.

Today's **offertory** is an arrangement of an old (1899) gospel song that may or may not be familiar to you. These are the words to the refrain:

Heavenly sunlight, heavenly sunlight, Flooding my soul with glory divine; Hallelujah, I am rejoicing, Singing His praises, Jesus is mine. As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Italy, Malta, Portugal, and Spain. We give thanks for faithful Christians who have nourished and renewed the long tradition of Christianity in these countries; for the Catacombs and all the other monuments where the history of early Christianity inspires a renewed faith; for pilgrims who try to find a deeper faith and a healing of the spirit; for those who welcome and care for migrants and refugees; and for Michelangelo, de Vinci, Titian, Velazquez and all who used their art to proclaim the gospel. We pray for the Vatican, and all who hold positions of power in the Roman Catholic Church; for an end to terrorism and violence; for wisdom and guidance in dealing with immigration issues; for the victims of human trafficking; for the unemployed; and for a renewal of the spirit of the church, amid an increasingly secular and materialistic society.
