Guest speaker will be Scott Van Krevelen, owner-operator of Van's House in Enid, Oklahoma. Van's House is a sober living environment for adult men and women who are in recovery from drug/alcohol addiction. Mr. Van Krevelen will discuss how parents can set healthy boundaries with adult children who are struggling with substance abuse issues. Parents Helping Parents is a network of parents and others concerned about alcohol/substance abuse among our young people (both adolescents and adult children). The group offers hope through shared experience, resources, and education. They promote prevention and intervention, collaborative efforts and increased access to information/services, and support. Holy Week at MPC: Our Palm Sunday service on March 29 will begin at 10:55 A.M. in Fellowship Hall. Please join us at 10:30 for fellowship & refreshments. We will have a Maundy Thursday service at 7:00 P.M. on April 2, also in Fellowship Hall. Communion will be served. Plan on coming to Easter breakfast at 9:30 A.M. on April 5. We'll have an Easter Egg hunt for the kids, and then celebrate our Lord's resurrection as we worship at 10:55.

As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for China, Hong Kong, and Macau. We give thanks for the survival and growth of Christians and Christian churches despite persecution; for those who struggle for human rights against

great odds; for those with a concern for the poor and disadvantaged; for ancient Chinese pottery and works in jade; and for Chinese characters, and the illuminating ink strokes of Chinese calligraphy. We pray for those suffering unemployment & homelessness; for the rural poor, and those forced to labor in the countryside; for refugees from North Korea; for women and female children, who do not have equal status or opportunity; for those suffering from forced sterilizations, abortions and infanticide; for marginalized groups such as the aged, disabled, single parent families, and migrant workers; for miners and all those who face hazardous working conditions; and for a reduction in the amount of pollution and environmental damage.
