We will enjoy a **movie night** in Fellowship Hall on Sunday, July 26 at 6:00 P.M. We will be showing *The Good Lie*, and hot dogs and popcorn will be available. This film is based on "The Lost Children of the Sudan". The four children featured are a composite of thousands of children who were orphaned after their village was massacred in the Second Sudanese Civil War. Consequently, they made an arduous and dangerous trek through the plains, enduring hardship, death, and sacrifice until they reached safety in a refugee camp in Ethiopia. Years later, these youths were among 3600 selected for resettlement in the United States. These young people had to adjust to an alien culture, as they dealt with their brutal past, as well as their future in a new country. Bring yourself, family members, friends and neighbors for fun, fellowship and discussion of the film.

As part of the ecumenical prayer cycle, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Belize, Guatemala, Honduras, and Mexico. Give thanks for: Those who have taken in refugees and the exiled. Communities that have cared for one another. Church leaders who have spoken on behalf of the downtrodden. Those who try to tell the stories of the poor to those who are rich. Tortillas, burritos, enchiladas, cactus, corn and beans. Ancient temples and ancient civilizations. Pray for: A peaceful settlement of the border dispute between Guatemala and Belize. Comfort and healing for the families and loved ones of Guatemalans killed and disappeared, and due process of law and justice for their killers. An end to human rights abuses by the military. The repentance and conversion of those who benefit from corruption. Justice, education and empowerment for the Maya and other indigenous peoples. Those who are unemployed, and those who must work in sweatshops under difficult and often dangerous conditions. Street children. All those living in poverty. Strength, wisdom and patience for the churches.
