On Sunday, August 30, OU's Director of Religious Studies, Dr. Charles Kimball will speak during the church school hour in Fellowship Hall on the topic of **Christianity and Islam in a Post 9/11 World**. Dr. Kimball is an ordained Baptist minister, author of five books, including *When Religion Becomes Evil*, and has been published in *The Christian Century* and interviewed by more than 700 TV and radio stations, as well as major news outlets. Dr. and Mrs. Kimball are associated with First Presbyterian Church in Norman. Please take this opportunity to join with both adult classes to hear Dr. Kimball speak; there will be light refreshments available. His presentation has been facilitated by Judge Charles Johnson.

We will have a **congregational meeting** following the worship service on Sunday, August 30. We will be voting on officer nominations for the class of 2018 as well as a proposal to confer Pastor Emeritus status on the Rev. Jim Burns (retired).

As part of the ecumenical prayer cycle, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for Oceania: American Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia (Maohi Nui), Kanaky, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, & Vanuatu. Give thanks for: The amazing diversity of these islands in the Pacific Ocean. Fish, oysters, deep blue waters, and those who know how to live in harmony with the sea. The strong presence of the church in these nations. Welcoming smiles. Communities that take care of one another. Pray for: The preservation of these island nations in the midst of global warming and rising sea levels. Those affected by earthquakes, volcanic activity and cyclones. The rights of indigenous peoples throughout these islands. An end to political unrest, violence and ethnic tensions. An end to political corruption and crime. Those who have been affected by nuclear weapons testing by France in French Polynesia and the United States in the Marshall Islands. Those who are impoverished and hungry, those who are unable to find employment or to make a living, and those who are unable to attend school.
