Our east **parking lot** needs to be repaved. This project is estimated to cost approximately \$68,000. Session has authorized a capital campaign for the month of September, 2015, with the goal of raising this amount. There are about 100 parking spots in the east lot so we are asking people to "buy" or donate enough for one parking spot—\$680 each. Please prayerfully consider donating toward this much-needed repair.

Memorial will host a **Pet Blessing** on Sunday, September 27 at 4:00. This will be in the courtyard, weather permitting. All creatures are welcome, and should be on a leash or in a crate. If you can't bring your pet, or you wish to remember a deceased pet, please bring their photo.

As part of the **ecumenical prayer cycle**, we ask you to pray for a particular region of the world each week. This week we pray for **Bulgaria**, **Hungary and Romania**. **Give thanks for**: The long history of Christianity in these countries. Those who give their lives to Christian prayer and service. The care given to places of worship as, with icon and art, they proclaim the Gospel. Those caring for orphans, the elderly, and others without resources or family to take care of

themselves. Those who make peace between ethnic groups. Those who fight against the abuse of women. **Pray for:** An end to corruption and organized crime, high unemployment, and limited supplies of food and housing. The environment, which continues to suffer severe degradation, and for all those who must deal with the pollution of the air they breathe and the water they drink. A renewed ecumenical spirit among the churches. Those who face discrimination, hatred and violence on the basis of their ethnicity and religion. The creation of stable economic and political systems that allow for the participation of all the peoples in these countries. Healing for those who suffered under Marxist regimes.
