transgender bodies,  
and racialized bodies—  
even when these bodies are our very own.  
God, remind us that we are made in your image.  
Help us learn to receive from your abundance  
so we can share all that we have with others.  
Let us see that the cups we longingly hold out  
are already full.  
May they overflow so that all will have enough!**
