## Clerk's Corner

Session held its regular meeting on Tuesday, March 17. There was one action from Session: Approval was given to use the Columbarium Memorial Fund to cover the cost of replacing the air-conditioning unit that services the columbarium. As a result of Indian Nations Presbytery, and the PC(USA) as a whole, passing the amendment to the Book of Order to allow same-sex marriages, Session will address whether to permit same-sex marriages in our facility at their regular meeting on April 21.

Session held a special meeting immediately following worship on Sunday, March 29. There they approved Charles & Alison Baker's request to join Memorial Presbyterian Church on reaffirmation of faith. # From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Well, this is awkward.

I really want to wish you a Happy Easter, but we are just not there, yet.

It is still Holy Week, Jesus is still on the path to the resurrection, faithfully making that journey through the last supper with his disciples, the long night that followed, the betrayals, the arrest, the trial and the crucifixion.

It is so tempting—now that's an interesting word choice—to bypass the tough parts of the story of Jesus, isn't it? We just don't want to have to face the son of God going through all that pain and misery.

I find that my life is often like that. I don't want to face what's really going on in my life or the lives of my loved ones. I want everything to be "happy, happy, joy, joy."

But we do a disservice to ourselves, our loved ones and to God when we try to ignore the depth of our lives. God sent God's very son to trudge through the muck of life, to really live a full human life, so that we would know we are never, ever alone. God will always be with us in the very deepest depths of our lives.

We have been given the gift of the resurrection, through which we can view the story and all the questions that arise from it. Do we have all the answers? Definitely not. But we do have the assurance of God's love and grace.

Even during Lent and Holy Week, we are still Easter People. Each Sunday we have the gift of worshiping our God who became one of us, went to the depths of hell for us, experienced life and death for us. And rose for us!

What a gift we have, and what a gift we get to share.

May we begin this Easter season with the full and complete knowledge of what God has done for us, and may we respond fully.

### THE ACTIONS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE LIFE OF DWIGHT MISSION

Number 8 of 12 short articles

The Rev. Frederick Schaub served as organizer and director of the Presbyterian Boy's Training School at Dwight Mission from 1900 to 1910. Early in his time at Dwight he continued in his monthly travels to other Cherokee churches which had no minister.

During the summer of 1902 he took his evangelistic work "on the road" with the formation of a caravan called "The Presbyterian Gospel Wagon." The Rev. Schaub was evangelist-in-charge. His co-workers were David Smallwood, interpreter; W. T. Morrison and A. F. Romig, Sunday School ministers; Neil Holderman, soloist, Miss C. H. Montgomery, organist; and Mrs. Della Schaub.

The caravan was an attention-getter in itself! Leading it was an old-time bicycle ridden by Mr. Morrison. Next was a large covered wagon bearing the camping necessities as well as Bibles, song books, Sunday School materials, organ, and a stereopticon. Finally was a buggy for the ladies. They camped out each night of their journey starting in near-by Marble City and on through ten more communities. A Sunday School was established in Baron and a total of twenty were converted to Christianity over their 175-mile trip. A similar caravan was conducted the following year.

Now fast-forward to present-day Dwight Mission's version of that caravan: Dwight-in-a-Van. A congregation can request this camp for one week at their own church. It comes with one trained young adult to direct volunteers teaching a Christ-centered curriculum which is activity-based. This program for children, kindergarten through sixth grade, aims to provide outreach through a quality outdoor experience. Where the Holy Spirit resides in God's people there are always innovative ways to spread His word!


