From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Last week, spurred on by the impending visit of a friend, I started cleaning out my guest room closet. It is the default place I use to store things that don't really have a place in my home. Apparently I have a LOT of things that "don't have a place!"

I began looking through a box of pictures, which were actually in the wrong place (I have a place for them!). I started categorizing them by periods of my life: time at seminary, work at my first church, that time I lived in California, etc. As I flipped through the pictures, I quickly passed by the photos of beautiful vistas, interesting buildings or lovely foliage. It was the pictures of people I knew that I sat with as I remembered the stories the photos told.

I couldn't help but share a few memories that came to mind. Thanks to cell phones and texting, I quickly took a pictures of a picture and sent it to various friends with a "Remember this?" or a "What was happening here?" Over the miles we shared our comments and reflections on our time together.

It's really quite simple. What is important to us are the relationships. At least that is what I am finding for myself. How about you? I treasure the interesting places I visit, but if I can't share those experiences, even in the retelling of them, what is the point?

That is what a faith community is about, too. We come together to share our stories. To remind each other of the faith journey we have travelled in the past and are now travelling together.

I have grown to love the portion of our worship where we share joys and concerns. I love that this congregation is a place where people feel safe and encouraged enough to open their hearts to let others know what is going on in their lives. All the things that are mentioned are important to someone, and so they become important to us all.

Our relationship with God is like this, too. We make ourselves vulnerable when we allow God into our lives fully. We are vulnerable because we can be changed. We are not in charge any longer.

These are risks we can take with God, and risks that we can take with one another. I encourage you to become vulnerable in your encounters with God as you become vulnerable in your encounters with God's children.

The session appointed Melissa Gill as his liaison. Samuel will need to travel to Oklahoma to meet with the presbytery's Committee on Preparation for Ministry, among other requirements. 
