

Dear Friend,

What if you were living on borrowed time?

Elise Solloway is awaiting a new lease on life. In 2004, Elise was diagnosed with autosomal dominate polycystic kidney disease, just a week after her sister was diagnosed with the same disease. Elise's illness leaves her very tired and takes a toll on her quality of life. Her kidney function has deteriorated over the years, and doctors say a kidney transplant is necessary for her survival.

During this difficult time, Elise is thankful for the love and support of her husband of 41 years, Robert, and their family and friends. Elise and Robert have a grown son and one grandchild with another on the way, and the whole family worries about her health. She looks forward to receiving a transplant that will give her back her energy and allow her to be more active. When her health allows, she enjoys photography, creative writing, journalism, and music. Elise wants nothing more than to be healthy again and enjoy life with her family and friends. But right now, she needs your help.

Unfortunately, Elise's hope for a new life comes at a very high price.

The average kidney transplant costs more than \$414,000, and that's only the beginning. Even with insurance, which will cover a portion of the transplant costs, Elise still faces significant expenses related to the surgery. For the rest of her life, she will need follow-up care and anti-rejection medications. Post-transplant medications are very expensive, and they're as critical to her survival as the transplant itself. Additionally, Elise will have to temporarily relocate over 140 miles when she receives her transplant to be near the transplant center while she recovers, incurring substantial expenses for travel, food, and lodging.

What if your life depended on the compassion and generosity of others?

The National Foundation for Transplants (NFT) is working with volunteers and supporters to help relieve the growing burden of expenses for Elise. NFT has been assisting transplant patients with fundraising support for 35 years.
