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

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

I have really struggled about what to write to you this month. Maybe you, like me, are feeling overwhelmed with the turmoil and disagreement in our country today and don't have words to adequately express your feelings, or maybe, also like me, you aren't even sure you can comprehend enough to even try to get to your feelings.

As an alternative, I have been intentionally focused on the gifts we have from God; trying to see what is positive in this world. I've also been watching *uncontroversial* movies and TV, picking up my hobbies again and focusing on what is in my reach to accomplish.

As people of faith, I hope that you will remember to take care of yourself, noting that Jesus observed Sabbath, and that we can't pour from an empty vessel.

We are one month away from Lent, when we begin our journey to the cross. Ash Wednesday is March 1 and we will hold our Ash Wednesday service that evening. I encourage you to attend.

In planning for the upcoming months, consider joining me for a limited series study.

I also invite you to attend a Lenten study I will be leading on Sunday evenings, beginning March 9 from 5:00 to 6:00.

We will study the book **Forgiveness**, written by Marjorie J. Thompson. Thompson is well known for her book **Soul Feast: An Invitation to the Christian Spiritual Life**. She is a Presbyterian pastor and spent thirteen years as Director of Congregational Spirituality with Upper Room Ministries.

This little book reminds readers that forgiving others and humbly asking for forgiveness are central disciplines for all Christian believers. It will address such questions as:

- Is forgiveness a Christian duty under all circumstances? Or are there situations when Christians do not need to forgive?
- Is forgiveness a matter between individuals, or is it meaningful only in the context of communities? Is forgiving the best route to healing for the injured?
- How do we get past emotional barriers to real forgiveness?

We are stronger when we work toward growth of ourselves individually and corporately. I hope you'll join me in this discussion as we look at forgiveness.

Worship and Music Committee

An ad-hoc committee is currently working to plan Ash Wednesday and Lenten services (possibly also Maundy Thursday, Palm Sunday and Easter) around the theme "See and Share" inspired by Rev. Evans' message "Come and See."

On-going responsibilities of this committee include but are not limited to securing ushers, head ushers, communion servers, and communion preparers, cleaning the baptismal fount, choosing appropriate banners, preparing the large-print hymnals and assisting the staff with preparation for services "that have special emphasis or feast day significance."

The next meeting is scheduled for February 13 at 6:00. If you are curious about our meetings, please come, see and share with us. All are welcome.

Building & Grounds

The church has contracted with 2 Green Chicks, a locally-owned, independent cleaning service, to clean the church facility. We have had hired janitorial staff in the past, but due to changing employment circumstances we were going to have to try and hire a new person for the position and felt this was a better way for the church to get our janitorial services done. They are to clean the church twice a week - a "full" cleaning on Friday evening to have the facility ready for services on Sunday, and a "quick" cleaning on Monday evenings to take out trash, check for other issues that need to be addressed, etc. (days and times subject to some changes). If you notice anything that needs to be brought to their attention relating to janitorial services please let one of the Building and Grounds Committee Members (Mike Girdner, Mike Cole, Donna Vint, Larry Upton or Holly Van Auken) know about it and we will put it on our feedback form to 2 Green Chicks.

Mental Health in Oklahoma

Several months ago, the session of Memorial Presbyterian Church determined that during the Church year the congregation would focus on a theme. For this year it will be on Mental Health in Oklahoma. This is in response to a call for justice, care, and hospitality for God's children, who suffer with challenges related to mental wellness, which have been enunciated by our denomination's General Assembly over many years.

Mental illness is a medical disorder characterized by a disturbance in thought, mood, or behavior that causes distress in spiritual, interpersonal, behavioral, and emotional functioning. It is estimated that 1 in 4 of us in our lifetime will experience some form of mental wellness challenges. In Oklahoma, over 630,000 people will suffer from such a life disruption – that is over 20 % of our population. Many do not receive the treatment they need. In comparison to other states, we are at the bottom in terms funding for needed services.

Because these challenges can impact on people in our community, and in our congregation, it was seen as imperative that we have a deeper understanding of the challenges associated with this kind of suffering. While the church cannot eliminate mental wellness challenges, we can have a deeper understanding of people who suffer with mental illness daily. Furthermore, we can share the message of God's love with those who more often than not feel isolated.

In the course of the year, various committees and groups within our church will be asked consider how their programming and activities can help in furthering greater understanding, and possible change.


