MISSION AND EVANGELISM COMMITTEE - OPPORTUNITY TO RECYCLE STYROFOAM

We have information about 2 ways to recycle Styrofoam, which the City of Norman does not collect for recycling.

University Lutheran Church, 914 Elm, has a Styrofoam collection station that is open weekdays from 10:00-4:00, and always on Sunday mornings.

St. Michael's Episcopal Church at Hwy. 9 and Imhoff also has a station that is open M-Th from 9:00-2:00.

At ULC, you enter the church from the parking lot BEHIND the church on College Ave. When looking at the building from the lot, go in the 2nd door from the north (left) end. It has a green sign in the side window that says "Styrofoam recycling." The room on the right, one foot inside the door, is the Styro-Station.

You can drop off ONLY "clean, Clean, CLEAN" Styrofoam other than peanuts or construction insulation Styrofoam.

Peanuts can be taken to many local package mailing places where they will be reused.

This collected Styrofoam is taken to the DART corporation in Ada. They ship it to their facility in Texas where it is remanufactured into products like crown molding, trim for planes, boats and motor homes, and inexpensive photo frames.

If we have a volunteer, we could consider setting up a collection station at MPC.




Crossword
