Long-term, we are looking at replacing the flat roof. It's been repaired a number of times, but it's been over 20 years since we have had a brand new roof. We are starting a fund toward those costs which will be used in the next few years.

Some might think that if we were faithful in our call as followers of Christ, we should take any money we have to spend on the building and use it to feed the hungry and clothe the naked. Use it to bring about God's justice on earth. Here's the news: both choices are correct.

In the midst of the Notre Dame Cathedral burning, a friend shared this poem by Rev. Dr. Peter Scaer:

The next meeting of Session will be on Tuesday, May 21 at 7PM.

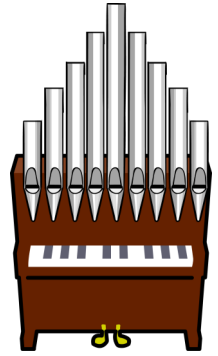
