### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

I am so impressed and excited about what we do here at Memorial!

If you have never been here on a time other than Sunday, you may not have seen all that happens in our building. It is a well-used place. We have 12-step groups (12 meetings each week), Boy Scout groups, Project Outreach which serves autistic children and families, we are a polling location, the League of Women Voters, and of course our new relationship with First Congregational Church. And there are more groups that use the building just occasionally.

All this goes beyond what we do as a congregation, which, if you were paying attention in October, is a LOT of activity for a congregation our size.

Our building is reaching out on our behalf! What a great witness that we have open doors that welcome others in the name of Jesus Christ.

And as you might guess, all this activity takes a toll on the structure. We rely on volunteers where possible, but we regularly call a plumber, electrician or other expert to assist us with care for this building. We work hard to care for this gift of a building we have inherited, and we pray that we are using it wisely.

You will be receiving materials soon for our pledge drive. Each year we ask you to consider prayerfully your support of Memorial Presbyterian Church and its mission. A pledge gives us an idea of what funds we will have to carry out our work as a congregation. The building is a big part of that work.

We call this stewardship. We are stewards of what we have been given by God. Good stewardship calls us to give thanks to God for all we have been given and recognize that God entrusts us with the care of those gifts. We are given time, talents and physical gifts, which include finances. We are called as Christians to return a portion of that to God, which shows our devotion and love for God.

I challenge you to make a pledge this year. Look at your anticipated income and take a percentage of that. If you have never done this, start with just 1%. Make a commitment to give that each week or month, then plan on growing that each year. Traditionally, 10% is considered a tithe to the church. It is what I give to Memorial, and I am grateful to be able to support the good ministry—including caring for the building which takes place here.

- (1) With the company's termination of the accounting software our church was using, a new product had to be found. With the help of Julie Forthman, Stewardship Committee recommended our church purchase the on-line version of Quickbooks. Session approved this purchase.
- (2) Session approved the Permanent Endowment Fund Committee recommendation to offer honorariums to the hunger panel participants.
- (3) Our church has allowed an outside group (Clay Polymer group) to use our facility for a 3-day workshop for the past several years. After review of our expenses, Session approved increasing the amount we charge this group from \$475 to \$600

A follow-up from that panel: Katie Fitzgerald from the Regional Food Bank told us about a recent rule change proposed by the Department of Homeland Security. This rule change would have adverse impacts on legal immigrants by expanding the list of programs those people receive that would disqualify them from receipt of a green card, to include SNAP (food stamps).
