Dear Friends,

I was in a store this week and I heard Christmas music playing overhead. I have grown accustomed to seeing all the decorations popping up in stores long before I'm ready. But there was something about hearing a Christmas song being played in October that made me pause.

It doesn't really offend me when retailers move early into their biggest selling days. I understand the need to make quarterly sales projections and business plans. We live in a capitalist society and it is the price (!) we pay.

But it is something different when we try to rush our own seasons. We have seasons of our lives that we need to live into. Too often we believe that if we just "get through X" or "wait until next week" or "when I have a new (job/car/relationship)" things will be better. But only looking ahead and not living the current season takes away the opportunity for growth in our lives. Every season has something to teach us. Even the worst days of our lives—painful though they may be—can bring insight and a deeper sense of God's presence. God seeks out those who need God most, and finds them most often in the depths.

Not long ago I was fortunate to go on a retreat where I learned, played and rested. This time allowed me to reflect on this particular season of my life, especially as it relates to care for my loved ones. I recognized my need to appreciate the time/season I am in and learn from it. It has its own value, beyond just something I wish would go away.

There is a short prayer that I would like to share with you as you go through your seasons:

Christ of Compassion – lead me on this journey.

Living God of Love – draw me near to your heart.

Gentle, Holy Spirit—comfort me, sustain me.

Trinity Presbyterian Church, OKC

Pastor Richard Mize welcomed us to newly approved *historic* Trinity Presbyterian Church, now listed on the National Register of Historic Places. "Trinity was the first congregation of any denomination in Oklahoma City, if not the state, to formally integrate—in 1960. It came with the merger of all-black Bethany Presbyterian, formed in 1904, and all-white Creston Hills Presbyterian, which started in 1945."

It is with joy that I bring you news of a transitioning presbytery—a presbytery connecting, sharing, guiding. We had a worshipful meeting, led by our moderator Bobbie Heimbach, Stated Clerk Tracy Evans, and the members and minister at Trinity. There was no bickering or animosity as in meetings of the past. Business was conducted with respect.

I am posting my packet on the bulletin board in the hall for anyone wishing to see a more complete picture.

Think about attending the "Healthy Pastors Make Healthy Congregations" Workshop presented by Stephen McCutchan on Thursday, January 23, 2020. The afternoon session "will be addressed to pastors, along with members of congregations (especially sessions) and members of presbytery, which will focus on working together to create a two year plan designed to help pastors grow in their spiritual, physical, emotional, vocational and financial health."

The venue and cost have yet to be determined.

Here is a letter from the Dwight Mission Board of Directors. This is a time of transition for Dwight Mission. Please read the letter and feel free to share the information.

Siblings in Christ,

As many of you have heard, this is a time of transition at Dwight Mission. People have reached out to find out more information and to offer help, so the Board of Directors wishes to catch you up on the current situation and what may be in the future.

First, let us make something very clear. Dwight Mission is not closed and is not currently in the process of shutting down. Our intent is to host all activities and groups planned for the remainder of 2019. We have heard some reports of people sharing news of closure, and want you all to know with certainty that this is not currently the case. We are open. If you have plans to attend an event at Dwight Mission in 2019, please come and invite friends to join you.

With that said, Dwight Mission is struggling to sustain ministry long term. For many years now, Dwight has run at a considerable loss. This was made possible primarily by financial assets from the past. That safety net of reserve funds has diminished greatly and is nearly exhausted. This means that if the ministry of Dwight Mission is to continue, significant changes must occur immediately.

The Board of Directors, recognizing our need for help in sorting this all out, has appointed a commission of highly talented and committed individuals to assess the situation and consider the immediate and long term solutions. These people bring financial, legal, and executive experience to the table along with a love for Dwight Mission's ministry and mission. This commission also includes leadership from the three Oklahoma presbyteries, as they are vital stakeholders in Dwight both as a site and ministry. The commission will come up with recommendations to the Board of Directors who will then determine the best course forward.

So, what do you need to know going forward? First, if you would like to host or attend a retreat at Dwight Mission in 2019, please do it! The more people come to camp, the more sustainable the ministry becomes. If you are interested, please call Director of Operations Richie Withycombe at (918)775-2018 and book your event. Please also note that Dr. Rob Duncan is no longer serving on staff and has retired in Florida. What happens after 2019? That is something we do not know at this time. The commission will be looking at a number of possibilities to sustain operations into the future, but we are not able to say what those possibilities might be at this time. The work on that question continues and your prayers are sincerely appreciated.
