Session met on Tuesday, September 22, 2015 and took the following actions:

- 1. Approved a funeral policy for Memorial Presbyterian Church.
- 2. Approved the following Building & Grounds expenditures:
 - (a) \$500 for tree trimming
 - (b) \$5,345.36 for new carpet in the Parlor, youth room and Sunday School classroom next to the library
 - (c) \$68,000 (maximum amount) for the repair of our parking lot
- 3. Approved the expenditure of \$336.16 out of the Columbarium Fund for the installation of vinyl tile in the Columbarium
- 4. Approved the hiring of Emily Ryther as Administrative Assistant on a temporary basis until a permanent replacement can be found.
- 5. Approved the request from Indian Nations Presbytery for Memorial Presbyterian Church to host the October 7, 2016 Presbytery Meeting at our church.







