





From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

In 1995, I had completed seminary and was in the midst of a year of Clinical Pastoral Education (a kind of chaplain residency) at the OU Health Sciences complex. In April, the Murrah bombing occurred, and we had our hands full with wounded survivors. My chaplaincy ended that summer and I took a job for the Presbytery of Indian Nations as the Disaster Response Coordinator.

Through this work, I learned about and participated in the follow-up of a disaster. Government agencies, community groups, non-profits and religious groups all work together to try to meet the needs of those most impacted.

The recovery from Hurricane/Tropical Storm Harvey will certainly be different than that of the bombing, but I can assure you that all the agencies will come together to work toward the rebuilding and recovery of southeast Texas.

Among those groups will be Presbyterians who have built a reputation among the disaster response community.

Because of my work in OKC, I was appointed to serve on the Advisory Committee for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, which I served for six years. I learned even more about disaster response, especially our connections and our work beyond the United States. I visited Malawi, a small country in Africa, where we witnessed food distribution, health clinics and schools that had been rebuilt as a result of the efforts of PDA. In San Salvador, El Salvador, we celebrated the completion of a community center in an area of hundreds and hundreds of corrugated tin homes.

At the end of August 2005, I was the Vice-Moderator of PDA's Advisory Committee. The Moderator and I were asked to go to Houston, San Antonio and Austin to help the congregations and presbyteries make ready for refugees coming out of the aftermath of Hurricane Katri-

na. At that time, PDA was in the early stages of having trained volunteers to deploy in disaster response. The well-trained folks were sent to Louisiana; we were clearly the "B" team, but we did what we could.

We visited the convention centers that we are now seeing on the news. We met with presbytery staff and church members who had no idea where to begin. Our presence, while it did not lessen the work to be done, gave them hope and assurance that they were not alone and would have guidance in the very lengthy process of recovery (and remember, these were not the areas that were affected by the hurricane).

In 2006, I led a group of volunteers from the church I was serving to Houma, Louisiana, where we stayed in a PDA "volunteer village" and worked on repair of a home that had been damaged in Katrina. We tore down, built up, cleaned and painted for a week, sleeping on cots, making our meals and building community not only in Houma, but in our own group as well.

PDA has supported the recovery of every major tornado we have had in Oklahoma. They have provided training to prepare for disasters as well as provide mental health support for responders and case managers.

I tell you all this (if you're still reading) to let you know how much I admire and believe in the work of PDA. They are known in the disaster community as "staying for the long haul." I suspect we will see their work in SE Texas for many, many years to come.

Please consider helping PDA as they work alongside the residents of southeast Texas. There is much, much work to be done. Through your support, we can say that we will be there "for the long haul," as the hands and feet of Christ in this disaster.

The Deacons met on August 6th. The meeting was primarily about the reception and lunch following Dave Iske's funeral.


